Taking PEFA to new heights: the upgraded PEFA indicator set

COURSE OVERVIEW

The PEFA Assessment Framework was extensively upgraded during 2013 & 2014, introducing new indicators and significantly revising many others. This new indicator set is now undergoing final field testing and is expected to be introduced later in 2015.

This course provides a detailed introduction to the testing version of the upgraded PEFA framework, explaining the changes made and their rationale and outlining the data requirements for their assessment. It will equip PFM specialists to apply the new framework (including the upgraded version of the Performance Report), and to interpret its results for PFM reform design. It will also provide an opportunity for direct interaction with the PEFA Secretariat by video-conference.

Andrew Lawson will be the principal facilitator of the 3 day event, drawing on over 25 years of international experience in PFM.

Andrew led the 2010 evaluation PEFA programme, was a member of Task Team B, advising on changes to the PEFA framework, has led 5 PEFA assessments and run several PEFA courses.
