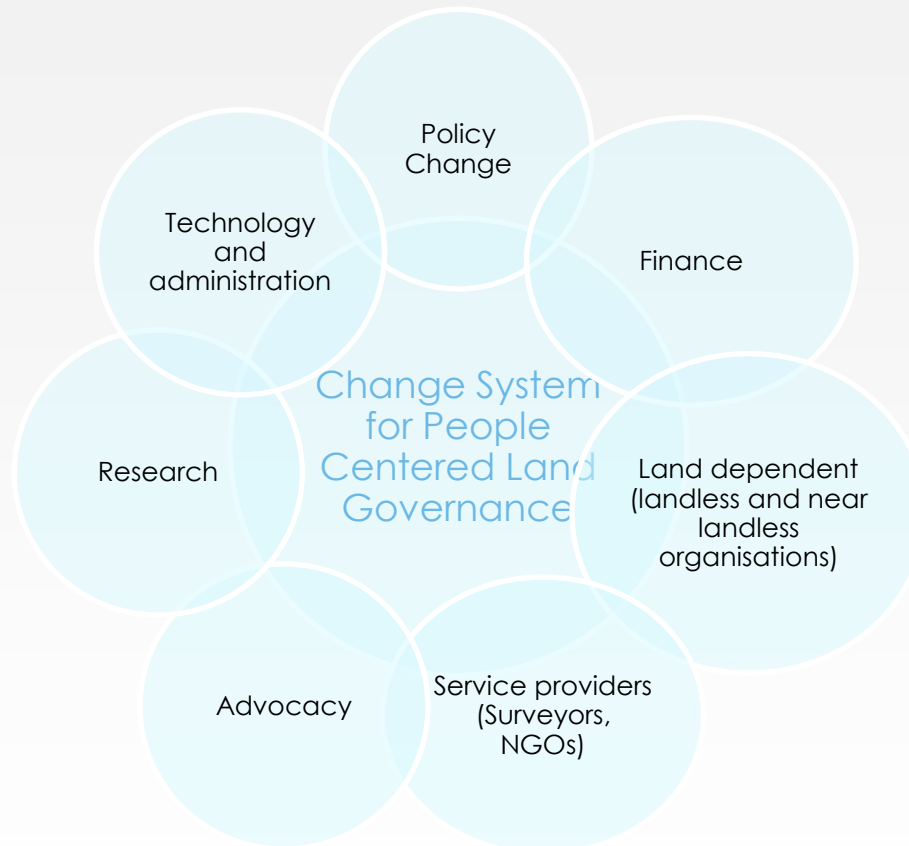

# National Engagement Strategies – NES

Grounded in the **actor based approach**, NES platforms have become a space for **constructive interlocution** among a diversity of actors.

It is the place for governments to approach, listen to and interact with civil society groups, representing an opportunity to **complement expertise and share knowledge for solution-oriented interventions**.

NES allow different stakeholders to discuss and build a **common vision** between themselves as well as within interest groups.

Furthermore, it acts as a **permanent multi-stakeholder land governance monitoring system** on reforms, public policies and trends related to land.

Ultimately, the NES platforms are beginning to demonstrate their intention, of **promoting collective action** towards the realisation of people-centered land governance.



## Main NES characteristics:

- *NES belongs to national ILC members and national actors*
- *NES platforms are made up of decentralised networks*
- *Greater multi-level participation in and inclusiveness of policy formulation and reform processes*
- *National and local level actions complement each other*
- *A balanced and comprehensive approach*
- *NES has focussed on and succeeded in changing perceptions among stakeholders*
- *A flexible approach*
