The Global Facility for Disaster Reduction and Recovery

Created in 2006, hosted by the World Bank,
supported by 37 countries, 9 international
organizations and 21 donors.

Mission:

Help high-risk, low income countries
reduce their vulnerabilities to natural
hazards, and adapt to climate change

Total portfolio (FY15):

280 grants in 70 countries

\$216 million (+29% from FY14)

Resilience to Climate Change within GFDRR

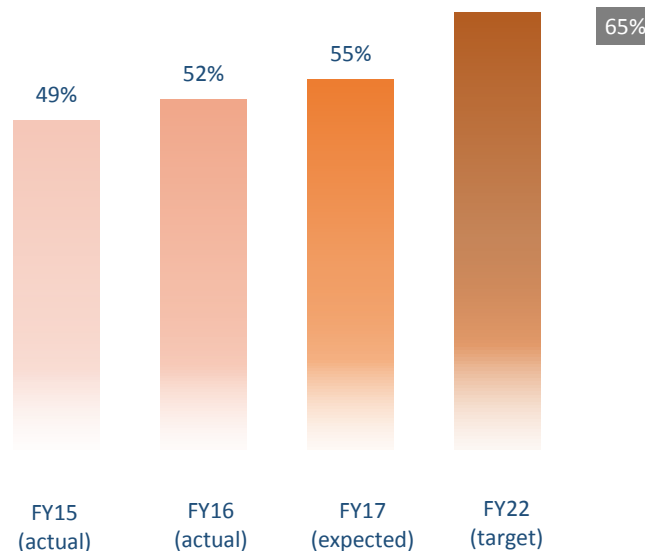
Unique opportunity:

- World Bank committed to increasing climate finance from 21% to 28% by 2020.
- All World Bank operations to be climate screened
- Increased base financing expected for Small Island States under next IDA cycle – benefiting 18 SIDS
- More resources for **Crisis Response Window** and a **contingent line of credit for disasters** (CAT-DDO) expected for poorest countries

Our objective:

- To increase the share of GFDRR grants supporting climate resilience
- To build on unique opportunity to influence World Bank commitments to resilience

The Small Islands States Resilience Initiative

- *Launched by the World Bank at the 2014 Samoa Conference and supported through GFDRR*
- ***It aims to enable Small Island States to reduce climate and disaster risks***
- *Mapping out sources of financing*
- *Building up a pipeline of resilience investments*
- *Rapid expert assistance on key aspects of resilience*
- *Global community of practice*



SISRI is a new approach, rather than a new program - it relies on established processes, projects and procedures between WBG and client countries

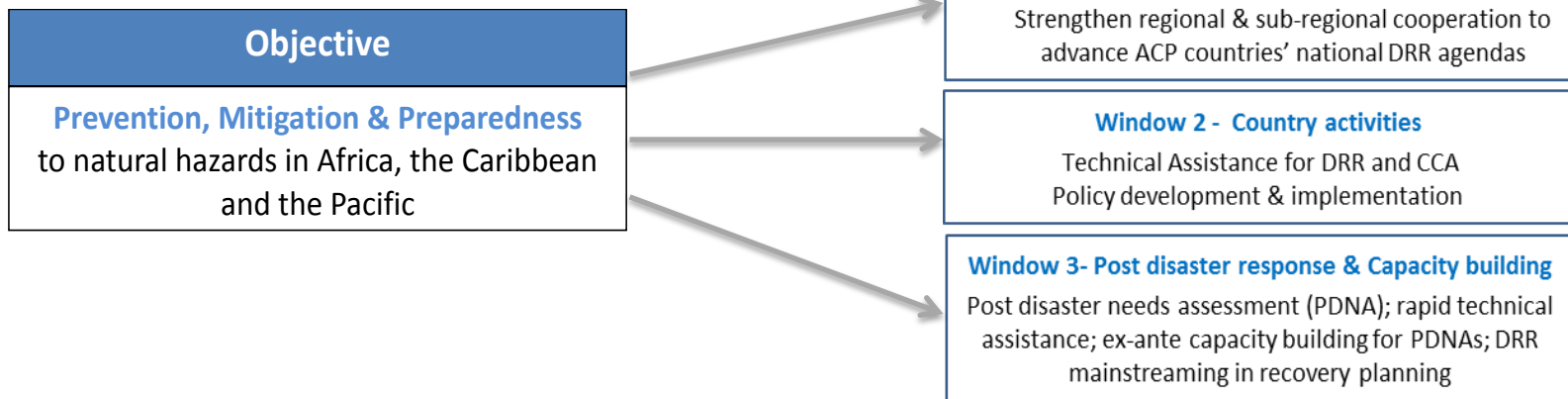

- Projects are implemented for Government authorities, by/with the World Bank, UN agencies, Regional Organizations and NGOs

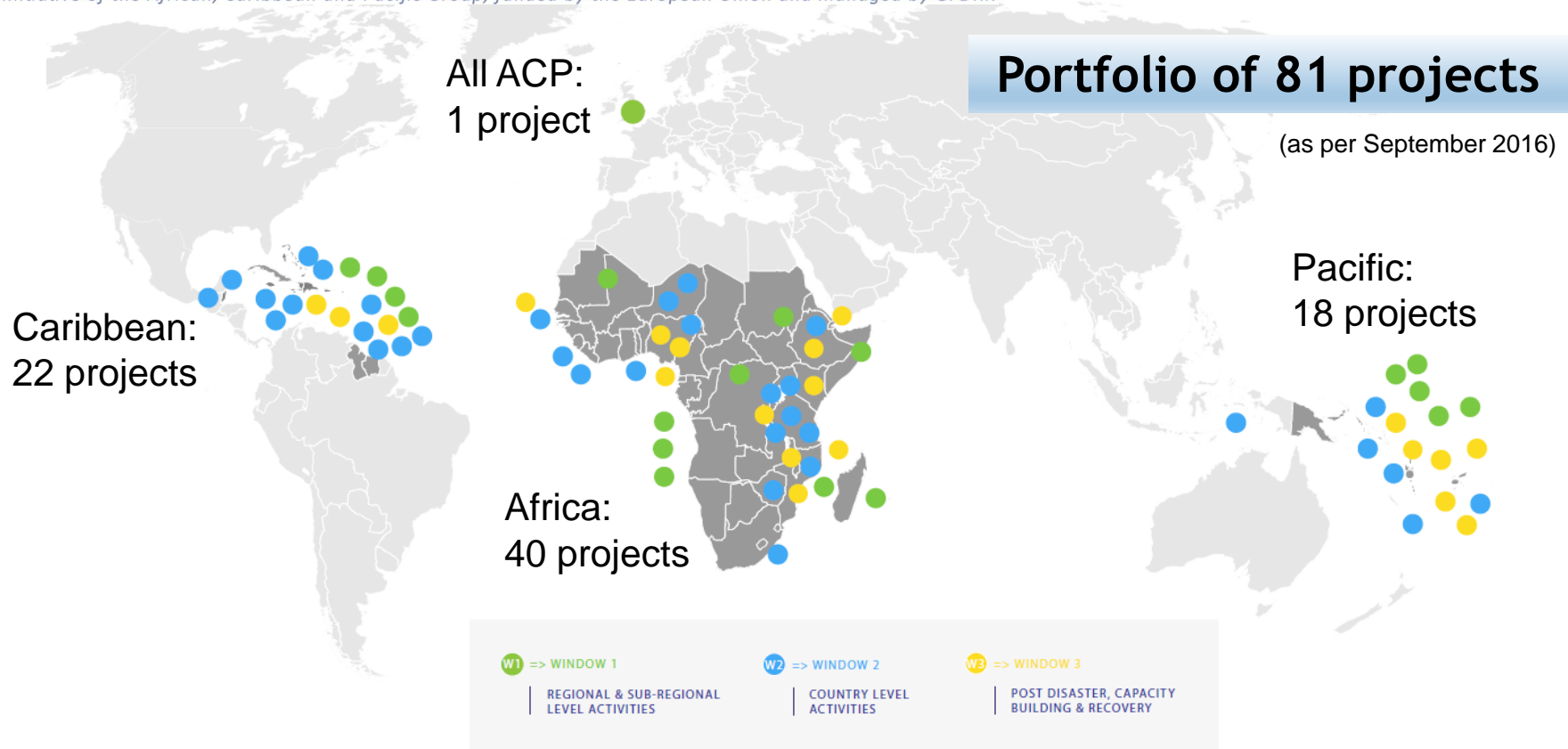

Launch:

- COP21 in Paris (Dec 2015)

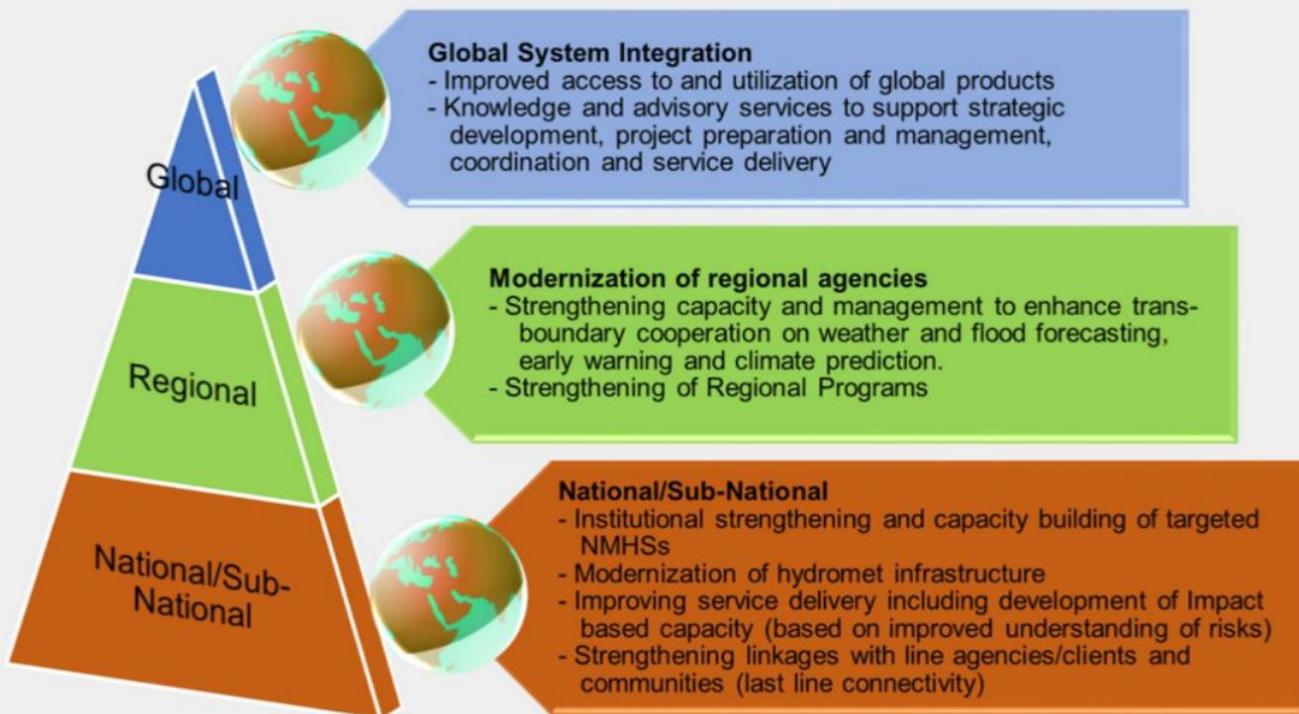
Rationale:

- The capacities of national meteorological and hydrological services and DRM related agencies remains unevenly low in LDCs and SIDS.

Objectives:

- To significantly increase the capacity for multi-hazards early warning systems.
- To generate and communicate effective impact-based early warnings, and risk information for hazardous hydro-meteorological and climate events .
- Directly contribute to target 7 of the Sendai Framework for DRR (2015-2030).
