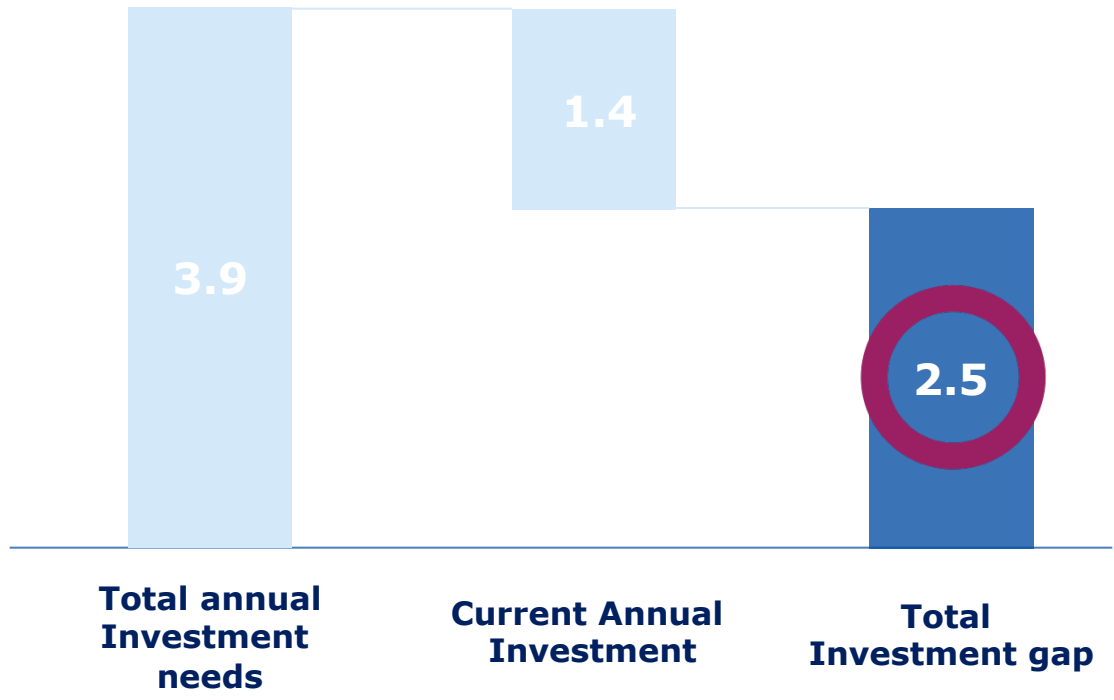
# Why we act – The investment gap to reach the SDGs

5. Digitalisation for Sustainable Development



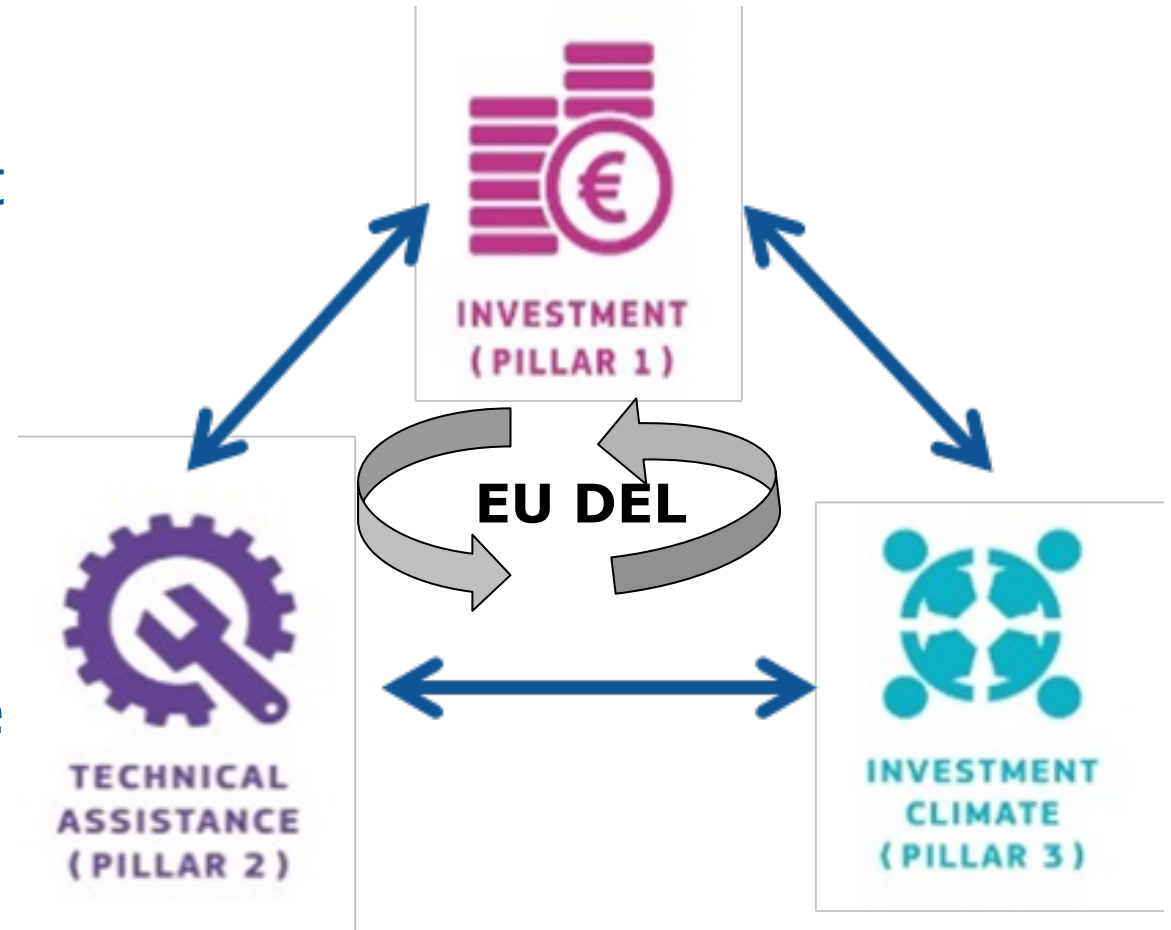
