# 1. Introduction

- 1.1. Introducing the character
- → the character will appear on the screen
  - → Hi! My name is 2QT. I'm from the planet Zgweegu.
- → the character hovers
  - → I am an inter-galactic fashion designer.
- → clothing appears in the background
  - → I design rocket propelled clothes.
- → rocket shoes appear in the background
  - → I came to Earth because I am fascinated by your shoes.
  - → I have a great idea: I can design rocket propelled shoes!
- → the EU is indicated on the map
  - → Europeans love shoes. I will make my shoes in the European Union.
- → 2QT puzzled (can't get his robot head around it)
  - → But if I start a business, I'll have to pay certain taxes.
  - → I wonder What is income and how is it taxed?

#### 2. The main characteristics of income tax

- 2.1. A presentation of income tax companies and individuals
  - 2QT and Louie the Accountant in front of an IT company HQ.
    - → 2QT: What happens here?
    - → Louie the Accountant: This is an **IT company** which develops computer games.
    - → 2QT: Oh! That sounds so much fun! I really love games! Can I have one?
    - → Louie the Accountant: Sure, but this type of game is quite expensive, so you have to buy one.
    - → 2QT: Can I buy a game with the rocket clothes I design?
    - → Louie the Accountant: Oh, unfortunately not! You will have to pay with money.
    - → 2QT: But why do I have to pay with money?







- → Louie the Accountant: Well, the company needs money to **produce** their products – like your game – to pay salaries to the employees and pay its taxes.
- → 2QT: So companies have to pay taxes too? Why?
- → Louie the Accountant: The law says that in the business world a company is considered to be a 'legal person' so it has to pay tax on its **income**, just like a real life human person.
- $\rightarrow$  2QT: What is **income**?
- → Louie: It's money that comes in to you. See?
- → 2QT: Oh! I get it. Comes in, income. Aha! So people and companies have to pay tax on their income. I see.
- Female computer engineer working at her desk (with a visible flipping calendar in scene). Time passes.
- The same computer engineer at her office receiving her monthly payment: animation – a bag of money divides into 2 unequal bags: 1 representing the net payment; 1 represents the taxes. 2QT is in the scene.
  - → 2QT: What is in these two bags?
- The background changes: Louie the Accountant explains the two bags of money:
  - → Louie the Accountant: 'They hold the money which this **employee is** paid by her employer in return for her work. It's also called salary, or her earnings.
  - → The small bag of money goes to the government to pay for the social systems and common needs (arrows towards icons: Hospital, Police, Fire Services, School, Public transport, Law & Order, Roads). She keeps the big bag of money, to save or spend however she likes.
- A woman (Martha) comes into the scene holding some money in her hand
  - → Louie the Accountant: Individuals can earn money in different ways.
  - → Louie the Accountant: Martha inherited money from her aunt. She paid it into a deposit account at her bank, and she receives yearly interest.
  - → Louie the Accountant: This is called **unearned income**, and she has to pay tax on it.
  - → 2OT: I had no idea!

#### 2.2. Taxes employees pay







- Image with 2QT and Louie the Accountant next to a Vault with a text above the Vault: State Treasury
  - → 2QT: Oh, this looks exactly like the entrance to my Spaceship! What is
  - → Louie the Accountant: This is the place where all the income tax is **collected**. From here, it is split up between different accounts.
  - → 2QT: Why in different accounts? Help me understand: what happens to the money from now on?
- Louie the Accountant goes to a presentation panel with 3 pictures representing a doctor taking care of a child, elderly people in the park and children in the schoolyard.
  - → Louie the Accountant: Let me show you the **benefits** that come from paying your **income tax**.
  - → 2QT: Oh, so you get something for paying your income tax?
  - → Louie the Accountant: Of course! First of all, a percentage of the State Budget (where the income tax is collected) contributes to the healthcare system.
  - → Louie the Accountant: This way, citizens have access to better medical services and can stay healthier.
  - → 2QT: What about children? Do they benefit from these taxes?
  - → Louie the Accountant: Of course! Besides healthcare, in some countries, the state gives a **monthly allowance** for each child, which is paid to the parents.
  - → Louie the Accountant: And the elderly benefit from financial support called a **pension**.
- An image with the Map of Europe appears with two colours: Blue for a flat tax system and yellow for progressive taxation.
  - → Louie the Accountant: Each country set its own rules for income tax. There are **two main types**.
- The map of Bulgaria pops out with a smiley face on it; the right corner: the flag, and the name: Bulgaria
  - → In my country, we have **flat income tax**. That means one tax rate which applies to everyone, no matter how much they earn.
- The map of Spain pops out with a smiley face on it; the right corner: the flag, the name: Spain
  - → In my country, we have **progressive income tax** which means that the tax rate increases as income increases. In short, those who earn a lot pay higher tax.







### 2.3. Benefits that come from income tax

- An image in an amusement park presenting a family with 2 children on the left, and Louie the Accountant and 2QT on the right side of the screen (animation: rollercoaster moving).
  - → 2QT: We have rollercoasters on our Spaceships, and they are such funl
  - → Louie the Accountant: You are lucky! Did you know that you can get some of your taxes back or pay less, and maybe come to this adventure park more often?
  - → 2QT: The state gives me money back? How is that possible?
  - → Louie the Accountant: Let me explain it to you. Do you see the family near the rollercoaster?
  - → 2QT: Yes, they are having so much fun!
  - → Louie the Accountant: The parents brought their children here with money that they may have saved through something called 'income tax reduction'.
  - → Louie the Accountant: For example, when a family has to care for children or family members who can't work, it has to spend more. So the state supports the family by reducing the income tax they pay.
  - → Louie the Accountant: So the family can use the money for a **holiday**, improving their **home**, buying **educational materials**, and so on.
  - → 2QT: I want to work and pay my tax to take care of the people!
