HERE'S YOUR CHECKLIST:



Travellers' rights and documents

Check which documents you - and the family members, partners joining you - will need. Plus, make sure they are valid!



Residence rights and formalities

Review the administrative requirements in your new country, whatever the length of stay or if you're a student, employee, pensioner or jobseeker.



Family

Make sure your loved ones have the right paperwork and information to get settled.



Employment and workers' rights

As an employee, freelancer or trainee, you need to be aware of your rights, benefits and tax regime abroad.



Professional and educational qualifications

Depending on your specialisation, it might be worth or necessary to get your qualifications officially recognised.



Healthcare

When moving to another country, you're protected from the unexpected with the European Health Insurance Card.



Unemployment and social security benefits

EU rules determine which country's social security system you should be insured under.



Pensions

Be sure to request information about your pension at least 6 months before you retire (where you were last employed).



Taxation

Familiarise yourself with the tax system in your new country (wages, pensions, benefits, property, successions, donations, etc.).



Vehicle registration

Car registration requirements vary depending on the EU country and your length of stay.
