Please identify adequately the goal and the objectives of the project. Summarise the key results that your project is seeking to deliver and the target group (if any) your project focuses on.
- How is your project relevant to the general objective of the European Solidarity Corps and what is its European added value?
The project should clearly refer to the European Solidarity Corps' principles and values. Please describe how your project expresses solidarity in practise and explain its European added value. The European added value can be expressed for example through topics linked with European issues (e.g integrating third-country nationals, climate change or democratic participation).
- How will your project benefit the communities and/or your target groups?
Please explain how your project will address the needs of communities and target groups(if any) by bringing real impact to them during and after the lifetime of the project.
- Please select the main topics of your project.
Make sure to select up to three main topics addressed by your project.

Quality Management

It is important to clearly present your working methods. All participants should be involved in a balanced way through various phases of the project and of activities. Make sure that cooperation and communication among the participants is effectively planned.

Activities

Project visibility and dissemination of results

Please explain how do you plan to disseminate the project results and what type of activities you will carry out.
